Braunton Countryside Centre The Chairman proposed and it was unanimously agreed to suspend Standing Orders to allow Ken Rutherford, Chairman of the NDET to speak.

Ken explained that the NDET's Connect 2 Nature Lottery Funding would end on the 31 December 2024. Part of the funding is to provide information boards regarding the Tarka Trail. It is proposed to attach two boards to the exterior of the North facing Countryside Centre building. The boards will be the same size and no bigger then 175cm x 150cm. They will be 3mm thick Aluminium Composite, fixed with screws.

The information boards feature maps of the Tarka Trail, images of wildlife, points of interest on the route and the code of conduct of the trail. At a later date it would be possible to add information about the Knowle to Willingcott route, once completed by the County Council.

Cllr G Bell was impressed by the information boards but felt the project could go further such as improving directional signage to the trail. He also expressed concerns that the lighting in the area was poor and requested if the installation of lighting could be included in the project. Ken Rutherford explained that boards could not be made any larger as they needed to fit between the pillars. He agreed that improved signage and lighting would complement the boards but this was not part of the NDET remit and should be installed by the relevant council as it is their land. The Clerk reminded members that the Braunton Masterplan prioritised improvements to existing waymarking particularly cycle routes.

Members agreed that the information boards were excellent and included a lot of information.

Ken Rutherford explained that the Lottery funding would end in December 2024. The community walks working with Live Well in Braunton have proved to a great success and it is hoped that these will continue when the funding ends. Other benefits of the funding include an increase in volunteers at the Countryside Centre and attracting experienced Trustees to join the NDET. Mark Ward a Marine Biologist from Somerset Wildlife will be working more closely with the Countryside Centre next year.

After serving 10 years Ken Rutherford would be stepping down as Chairman and leaving the NDET, along with his wife Libby. They had both served on the Trust for the past 10 years. The Countryside Centre is financially stable and the Trust is doing well with volunteers. Ken and Libby both feel it is time to let someone else take the lead.

The Clerk informed Ken that the NDET's Parish Grant had been approved and an official letter would be received shortly.

The Council thanked Ken and his wife Libby for their 10 years hard work serving on the NDET.

The Chairman welcomed Ben Byrom the Community Flood Warden to the meeting.

During the recent storm Darragh many residents in Braunton and the surrounding area were without power. This identified a need within the Plan as the current Plan did not address prolonged power cuts. Many of the public houses had power during the power cuts. Ben suggested that the Council write to the public houses and ask if they would be willing to provide electricity and a safe refuge for vulnerable people if a similar incident resulting power cuts for a considerable time were to occur.

Ben proposed holding an awareness workshop in the new year. He has contact a colleague in West Down Parish who has experience dealing with emergencies and would be willing to run the workshop. This would raise awareness of the Braunton CEP and might help to recruit more volunteers.

- to hold an awareness event open to the public in the New Year. Ben Byrom to help organise the event.

Following discussion, the Council concluded that it was supportive of allowing parish and town councils to meet remotely but did not support Proxy Voting.

RESOLVED: That the Clerk be instructed to respond to the both parts of the consultation expressing the Council's views. (NC)

### 226/2024/25 **Budget 2025/26**

The Clerk, prior to the meeting, circulated a revised budget 2025/26 including the recommendations from the Parks and Gardens Committee at its meeting held on the 4 December. The proposed amendments to the budget included:

- 8% increase in parking permits.
- 2.2% increase in employers NI contributions.
- Reduce 'Elections' budget to £2k, with an earmarked reserve of £6k.
- Reduce 'Bakehouse Centre' budget to £2k.
- Reduce 'Public Conveniences' budget to £7k.
- Reduce 'Motor Fleet; budget to £10k, with an earmarked reserve of £15k.
- Reduce inflation across all headings to 2% as UK inflation in November was 1.7%.
- Reduce improvements to Anchor Area to £12,500.
- Reduce replacement of fences to £1,500.

Following discussion, the Council agreed to increase its precept by 34%. Based on the 2024/25 Council Tax Base (3091), and the estimated increase of 133 second homes that would pay 100% Council Tax in 2025/26 this would equate to an increase in the Band D Equivalent of 45 pence per week.

- a. Council's budget for 2025/26 be set at £584,507 as detailed in **appendix four**.
