Preservation of Braunton Gates Crossing Track

The Railway closed in 1970, and over the last 55 years the railway infrastructure has slowly been lost to modernisation and development.

The Parish Council would like to see the last remaining level crossing tracks in Braunton preserved and added to the Braunton History Register. They are located on Chapel Street by Station Road and there are also some tracks still at Stoney Bridge.

The proposal is to have these last remaining pieces of track listed as an historic part of Braunton so that the railway heritage of the village is preserved for future generations.

The railway was such a large part of Braunton history up until its closure and now there are only seven pieces of railway left; there is a real danger of losing the tracks to any future road development if it is not listed.





Braunton Gates was one of many level crossings within the Braunton area and marked the start of the station complex.

The Gatekeeper controlled only the level crossing gates, when unlocked by the Braunton Signalman who had charge of all the signals.

This picture, taken in the early Southern period, shows clearly the station ahead with the Goods Yard to the right, in the middle of the photo. If you look to the road beside this panel, you can still see the track embedded in the road.

The 5 other areas of the old railway which remain are the signal on Station Road, the old Goods vard where the Museum of **British** Surfing now resides, The old Station Master's House (now home to The Green Newsagent), Station Road (in name only) and the old signal box, now in private ownership, at Georgeham Cross.
